









On the 14th of September, 2006, at of 22:.00 hours, "Imperial Tailor" housed in the salon's guest court coducted and presented the "Distributed Concert", a project which was aptly called, "Jazz with the Speed of Light". This was acheived in a flash falling well within the framework of the Fourth International Jazz Festival in Koktebele, the "Jazz Koktebele 2006".

"Jazz with the Speed of Light", was only a part of the large festival, in which talented musicians participated, from the entire constellation of musicians drawn, not only from Russia and Ukraine, but also from entire world. The Chief Expositor, of the festival of this year - the legend of jazz, Stanley Clarke, Kenny "Blues Boss" Wayne and Billy Cobham, were featured and gave an outstanding performance. It is opportune, and to be noted as a fact, that in Moscow, piano party conducted the outstanding jazz improvisator from Israel.



The party, also featured Leonid Ptashkya, who with the support of the soloist from the Bolshoi theater, the trumpeter Andrey Ikova, thrilled the audience. In the ensemble, with them on the specially elevated scene, over the seaside area in the memorial house of poet Maxmillian Voloshina, in Koktebele, played the musicians, who were invited to the festival. Everyone participated and in the melee, everyone rejoiced. It was an innovative new musical product. Furthermore it was

Koktebel 2005 was the center, which made first use of the technology, using avant garde techniques to transmit sound and picture, to create and effectualize a complete synchronization of game.
